

ORDINANCE 59

AN ORDINANCE TO PROMOTE THE PUBLIC SAFETY BY REGULATING THE LOCATION AND MANNER OF CONSTRUCTION OF SERVICE STATIONS AND GARAGES, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF

The Village Council of the Village of Bird Island do ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, persons or corporation hereafter to erect within three hundred feet (300 ft.) of any other filling station of service station or within two hundred feet (200 ft.) of any church, theater, school or any place of public assembly, or within two hundred feet (200 ft.) of any place of human inhabitation within the limits of this village, any public garage, gasoline or oil service station, or dry cleaning establishment or any private garage to house more than two motor vehicles.

Section 2. Whenever the proposed location of any public garage, gasoline or oil service station, or dry cleaning establishment or private garage to house more than two motor vehicles is lawful, such structures shall have stone, brick, tile or cement walls, cement floor, and incombustible roof. Such structures, if heated, shall be heated only by steam or hot water, or forced hot air and the heating plant shall be enclosed within a fireproof room.

Section 3. Any person, firm or corporation, who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine of not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than five (5) days nor more than three (3) months.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication according to law.
